




# Regional greenhouse gas emissions by source



Estimated percentage change in statewide traffic volumes by vehicle class, Wednesdays, March-August 2020





# Travel increase during COVID-19 recovery


If only 25% of pre-COVID transit trips are replaced by car trips:


- Drivers will spend







## **Current EV & Charging Infrastructure Landscape**


#### **Key Insights**

403 L2s @ 127 sites 19 DCFC @ 13 sites - does not include Tesla

Every community area has registered EVs

70% of all public charging is located in just 3 community areas

47 of 77 community areas do not have a single public charger



## **Chicago EVSE Barriers Addressed**



#### **Easy Home Installation**

Easy, online expedited permit process for station installations

#### **Regulatory Clarity**

Illinois Commerce Commission determined that EVSE operators are not deemed sellers of electricity and therefore not regulated as such

#### **Multi-Unit Dwelling Support**

70% of Chicago residents live in multi-unit dwellings. DriveElectricChicago.org provides a guide to help with infrastructure development

Chicago also has EV owners/advocacy group, Chicago for EVs





## Chicago's EV Readiness Efforts: EV Readiness Ordinance

### **Residential Buildings**

- New construction
- 5 or more dwelling units
- on-site parking

Link to Ordinance

- At least 20%, 1 minimum
- EVSE-Ready or -Installed

### **Non-Residential Buildings**

- New construction
- 30 or more parking

spaces

- At least 20%
- EVSE-Ready or -Installed

If an accessible parking space is required, at least one of the EVSE-Ready spaces must be accessible.
